MTCA LOBBYIST REPORT – APRIL 2007

The action at the State House continues to heat up as we head into the next step of the FY2008 state budget process – the State Senate – and the various legislative committees hold hearings on the thousands of bills assigned to them.

STATE BUDGET

The Senate budget was released on May 16th and will be debated by the full Senate May 23-24. Here's a look at the Senate budget's line items of interest from the Secretary of State's Office for FY 2008 as we head into the Senate budget debate:

0511-0270	The state secretary may contract with the UMass Donahue Institute to provide the commonwealth with technical assistance on US census data and to prepare annual population estimates	\$800,000

0521-0001	For the operation of the central voter registration computer system; provided, that an annual report detailing voter registration activity shall be submitted to the house and senate committees on ways and means on or before January 31, 2008	\$4,865,473
0524-0000	For providing information to voters.....	\$583,744
0527-0100	For the operation of the ballot law commission.....	\$12,380

In other budget news, the General Court has passed a FY2007 supplemental state budget (House 4022) that includes \$815,000 in additional funding for the State Secretary's Office. \$627,000 will go towards the cost of the special election for the congressional seat vacated by Marty Meehan and \$189,000 will go towards the cost of three special House races held so far in 2007.

ELECTION DAY REGISTRATION (EDR) - A/K/A SAME DAY REGISTRATION

We're getting ready for the start of the debate on EDR as the Election Laws Committee has scheduled a public hearing on May 30th on this issue. Just two bills will be heard that day – House 646 and Senate 446; the text of these bills is identical. Here's a look at the list of sponsors for both bills¹:

SENATE 446 SPONSORS: By Ms. Creem, a petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 446) of Cynthia S. Creem, Edward M. Augustus, Jr., Ruth B. Balser, Jarrett T. Barrios and other members of the General Court for legislation relative to election day registration.

In preparing for this hearing and our subsequent work on this issue, the Clerks EDR Task Force has been meeting and discussing these proposals. At this point the EDR Task Force is serving as a resource for the MTCA Legislative Committee since the MTCA as a whole has not yet taken a position on EDR.

Our objective at this point is to raise issues of concern, especially for town clerks, should the General Court go forward with EDR. Among the issues of concern raised are the length of time needed to add new voters to the voter rolls, cost of implementation, and acceptable identification needed to register.

MTCA LEGISLATOR OF THE YEAR

Representative Peter Koutoujian (D-Waltham), the House Chairman of the Public Health Committee, has been named the MTCA "Legislator of the Year." As you may know, Chairman Koutoujian is no stranger to clerks' issues since his father, Peter, served for many years as the City Clerk of Waltham. As House Chairman of the Public Health Committee, he has been very involved in a number of clerks' issues, including our vital records legislation; it was his committee that reported our bill out favorably last session and that worked so closely with former state representative Tom O'Brien on this issue. You may recall that Representative Koutoujian spoke at the 2005 Clerks' Day on the Hill.

Judith St. Croix, President of the Massachusetts Town Clerks' Association, called the business meeting to order at 12:50 P.M.

Secretary's Report: Ann Click, Secretary, presented the MTCA Business Meeting minutes for October 5, 2006 which appeared in the January Recorder. The motion to waive the reading of the minutes was presented and carried unanimously by voice vote. The motion to approve the minutes was presented and carried unanimously by voice vote.

Treasurer's Report: Carole Marple, Treasurer, presented the Treasurer's Report as of February 5, 2007. The current checking account balance is \$11,040.21 and the Business Fund balance is \$44,377.76 for a total of \$48,169.97. The motion to approve the Treasurer's Report was presented and carried unanimously by voice vote.

Judy St. Croix, President, presented the Bylaw Amendments that appeared in the October Recorder as recommended by the Bylaw Committee. The motion to approve the bylaw amendments was presented and carried unanimously by voice vote.

The following new clerks were recognized, Sudbury, Rosemary Harvell, Milford, Acting Town Clerk, Amy Hennessy-Neves, Uxbridge, Joseph Kaplan, West Newbury, Larry Murphy, Reading, Assistant Town Clerk, Julia Rodger, Dedham, Paul Munchbach, Longmeadow, Katherine Ingram, Richmond, David Morrison, Montague, Deborah Baurbeau, Ashburnham, Linda Ramsdell, and Littleton, Diane Crory.

CMMC Certifications were awarded to Christine Furno, Douglas, Ellen Gaboury, Auburn, Nancy Morrison, West Bridgewater, Michael Palmer, Falmouth, and Mary Kennedy, Williamstown. The following received their First Recertification; Judith Sullivan, Colrain, Mary Ellen Siok, Great Barrington (not present), and Leslie Bracebridge, Shutesbury. Janet Linehan, Easton although not present will receive the Second Recertification and Sarah George, Middleton received the Third Recertification.

President Judith St. Croix announced that Linda Hutchinrider, Barnstable and the Nominating Committee would like to hear from anyone interested in serving on the positions that will be begin as of June. Linda will also put out an e-mail regarding offices that will be available for the June conference.

Legislative Committee Chairman, Larry Pizer, Plymouth, introduced the new members, Russell Patten, Swampscott and Wendy Houle, Sunderland. He also recognized and thanked past Chairman Mary Lou Murzyn, Kingston.

President Judy St. Croix introduced MTCA Lobbyist Stephen Roche. Steve said there are a lot of new faces at the State House although there were not many changes in the House and Senate Leadership teams. Rep. Garrett Bradley, Hingham, will be the new House Chair for the Election Laws Committee and Senator Augustus remains the Senate Chair of that committee. Steve said he has heard from several legislators that they have filed a number of bills of interest to the MTCA. Included are bills relating to Election Day Registration (EDR), early voting, and at-will absentee voting. Steve reminded us that the proposed constitutional amendment on absentee voting is up for a second vote this session. A bill has been filed as an Act to update Animal Control Laws. A further summary of Steve's report will appear in the upcoming Recorder.

Secretary of State, William F. Galvin spoke next. The Secretary wished President Judith St. Croix well. The Secretary then announced that he had selected the ES & S AutoMARK as the accessible voting equipment. He said that delivery and training would begin in order that the equipment may be used at the

upcoming spring elections. The Diebold System will be licensed on a limited basis for districts unable to use the AutoMARK. He stated that the AutoMARK protects the privacy and confidentiality of the voters. The Secretary said that protection screens and tables for the equipment will be provided. The Secretary said that the AutoMARK is as close to fool proof as we can get. Harry Petrucci will be doing training in the western part of the state and Bridget Simmons will do training in the eastern part of the state.

Next, Secretary Galvin announced that Kathleen Ludgate is the Regional Director for the 2010 Federal Census. He also said it is important that local election officials will be able to review local lists for the LUCA Program. He also said that the long form has been abolished and only a short form will be used.

Secretary Galvin then answered some questions. One clerk asked if the local election costs will be covered by the State. The Secretary said that the local election costs will be covered for 2007, but he added that we will find that the programming is not too technical. A clerk asked if the Federal Census information could be run against the State system. The Secretary said no because the Federal Census people are concerned with multiple dwellings. A clerk asked if a town with more than one representative district would be served by the AutoMark machines. Secretary Galvin said yes they would, but his intent is to give out multiple machines to those communities. The Secretary thanked the clerks and left the meeting.

At 1:20 P.M. a motion was made and seconded to adjourn the meeting. The motion was presented and carried unanimously by voice vote.

News from the Registry of Vital Records and Statistics

Essex County Training Session

The Registry of Vital Records and Statistics gave a training session for the Essex County Clerk's Association in Middleton on April 19, 2007. This was a ½ day session on Affidavits and Corrections for birth, death and marriage records. The Fact Book for Affidavits and Corrections and the Evidence Guidelines for births, marriages, and deaths were also distributed for reference. This will be the same presentation and handout at the Clerk's meeting at SeaCrest in June.



Notes from the death record examination and coding staff:

One staff member here at the Registry mentioned that a large number of records are sent to the Registry with the Standard Certificate of Death and the Pronouncement of Death forms stapled together. These staples must be removed here at the Registry before the forms can be examined and registered. There is also a danger of damaging both records during the removal process.

As an alternative method, can Clerks paperclip these two forms together rather than stapling? I know we all run the risk of having the Pronouncement and the Death Record loose sight of each other in the crowd, but it would be easier to search for a few forms rather than unhitching hundreds of documents. Thank you!
